This Friday's sale included 18 cattle put forward for the Thame with Vale of Aylesbury Christmas Prime Stock show, which was kindly judged by Mr P Gentry. The Champion beast was a Limousin heifer from the Ludgate Family, Leighton Buzzard which sold for £4120 to regular Bockmer Farm LTD. The Ludgate family took reserve Champion also, with another Limousin heifer selling for £4400 to P Frazer. Another Limousin heifer from Mr J Clarke sold for £2680 to Seahawes for their farm shop.

Will Selmes topped the steers with an Aberdeen Angus X at £2600.

269 store cattle topped at £1715 for a pen of 4 Aberdeen Angus X from K Slade at 19 Months. Noel Doran followed at £1700 and £1650 while Angus X Dairy from Peter Brown sold at £1502 and Barry Sutton £1490.

Connell Partnership sold Limousin X at £1490 while Blue X Dairy from Peter Brown took £1490 also and Murray Grey X £1480.

M/S Singleton sold a Run of 35 Aberdeen Angus suckled calves homebred and weaned to £1100 and an average of £1058.78.

M/S FM&JM&J Shoulder sold their pen of pure Simmental heifers 24 Months at £1500 and one Angus X heifer the same. Nigel Jackson sold his Angus X heifer at £1410 as did Barry Sutton for a pen of 7 Angus X Dairy.

Nick Jones Bordon sold his pair of Charolais at £1360 followed by Incley Farming at £1330 for homebred Limousin X.

Blue X Dairy's from Barry Sutton sold to £1360.

Limousin Feeding cows sold to £1700 from David Plested. Simmentals from M/S Priddle £1650 and Herefords from M/S Ludgate £1600.
