Another strong entry this week met a consistently strong trade for the better finished stores at 18-24 months – a number of cattle close to, or just over, 30 months would have been better sold two months ago. Today's entry included several runs of plainer cattle which were a little difficult to sell.

Messrs D J & D J Parker topped the trade with their homebred Limousin x steers to £1812 and £1700 at 17 months. Malmswood Farm topped the Aberdeen Angus at £1720 for homebred suckled, followed by Philip Misselbrook at £1670 and Messrs A White & Son at £1660. Aberdeen Angus x dairy from Barry Sutton topped at £1622. Aged Simmental x from Mr A Taylor sold to £1665. Messrs Englefield Farms sold their pure Hereford steers at 17 months to £1360.

Graham Gregory sold his lorry load of steers and heifers to £1750 for a 21-month Limousin x heifer. Duncan and Diana (Parker & Bird) sold Beef Shorthorn to £1700 and Limousin x to £1670. Philip Misselbrook sold Aberdeen Angus to £1600 and £1490 while Barry Sutton took £1590 for Aberdeen Angus x dairy. Charolais x dairy from Messrs Jellis took £1585 while British Blue x dairy from Messrs Connor sold at £1460. Englefield Farms took £1360 for their top pen of Hereford heifers.
