- Please ensure stock is ready to load before lorries arrive it is not fair to have drivers waiting making them late for next collections.
- To comply with the Welfare of Animals in Transport Act any un-sound stock will require a vet certificate before loading.
- Young bulls must be 12 months + one day of age.
- Producers under TB restrictions should make sure they are issued with an AMENDED TB24C LICENCE authorizing general movement of bovines directly to a licensed slaughterhouse or via an approved TB slaughter gathering (Tuesday collection center)

Trade remained relatively level through October with a 5p increase reported at the end of the month. Producers selling cattle to make room to house off sodden fields leading to a short-term increase in suppliers in the first 2/3 of the month. This should make supply short in November when processors are boxing for Christmas. Watch out for big price increases! Cattle can only be sold once.

Commercial R grades 520 p/kg. Angus 525-530 p/kg. Beef Shorthorns to 525 p/kg.

Cattle doing well in yards with producers waiting to feed maize if they have managed to get it in the camp with the constant wet weather.

Several runs of tremendous cattle placed with £2000 beasts becoming more numerous with 390kg R grades now achieving the magic figure. Weighted black and whites now achieving £2000. A good load of averaged weighted bulls saw Charolais to £2268. Angus to £2250 and Limousins to £2345, £2260. Best Limousin steers to £2205.

OTM Clean, Mature Bulls, Barren Cows (339)

More cows placed in October as dairy farmer remove unproductive cows at housing and suckler producers have a tidy up at weaning and scanning. Trade follows the usual patten of slipping through the month but with an increase of clean price at the end of the month trade should hold. Cows back 10/15p through the period with some firms dropping 10p in one week.

Again, a large number of non-assured or VAN accompanied cows placed as more store breeders drop out of assured schemes. Cows finished the month at 395 p/kg with better fleshed cows 400 p/kg.

Producers are urged to keep an eye on cattle ages with a 10 p/kg deduction now implemented. If cattle are fit under 30 Months don't let them slip over.

New Season Lambs (1369)

A few loads placed this month with lambs starting to perform a bit better and especially if fed.

Trade remained level through the month with R grades to 620 p/kg. unless lambs are well fleshed, they don't weigh heavy and producers are finding they need heavier liveweights to achieve a 20kg carcass. A number of producers have sold as stores.
