Another successful day's trading met fierce demand for the younger cattle, while the 2 years old cattle were a little less on the week. Marsh Hill Farm topped the steers with an Aberdeen Angus 24 months at £2500. J H Tapping & Son Followed at £2370 & £2300 from James McIntosh for Dairy X. M/S P & D Warren sold their Charolais to £2370 at 17 months. 12-month steers topped at £1805 for Limousin X 10 months from A Christian. Richard Lacey sold Aberdeen Angus X to £1740 at 12 months while Micheal Moss took £1725 for Beef Shorthorns at 10 months. M/S M L Honour sold Simmental Heifers to £2330, £1965 & £1920 at 21 months.

Marsh Hill Farm topped the heifers with Aberdeen Angus X at £2300 (25 months) followed by Angus X Dairy from Ray Farm at £2220. J H Tapping & Son sold to £1990 for Limousin X. Young Heifers sold to £1560 at 12 months from Mr A Christian for Limousin X. 12-month South Devons from PJ & SJ Waters sold to £1460. 10 months Aberdeen Angus topped at £1290 from Mr D W Partridge. 12-month Beef Shorthorns £1200 from Micheal Moss.

Young Bulls sold to £1180 for Beef Shorthorn X at 11 months.

Beef Shorthorn Feeding Cows topped at £2200 MW Home Farm LTD.
