Trade must be quoted a little easier for the plainer cattle while the strong sorts have held their trade. Aberdeen Angus the flavour of the day this week topping at £1740.00 for a paid of steers 22 months from Noel Doran. Aberdeen Angus x dairy from Kingston Stert Farm sold to £1660.00, £1605.00 and £1600.00 followed by M/s Clearfields Farm at £1550.00 and £1100.00, who also went on to sell Charollais x dairy to £1550.00 and Simmental x dairy the same. Les Moore sold his Simmental suckled to £1610.00.

A homebred Limousin 17 month from M/s Longwood Farm sold for £1680.00 followed by a young bull at £1640.00. Beef Shorthorn x from Les Moore sold to £1530.00, Friesian Holstein steers from M/s Cole sold to £1272.00.

Aberdeen Angus x from M/s Gardner & Son, topped the heifers trade at £1470.00 and £1400.00 at 20 months, Aubrey Taylor took £1400.300 at 20 months. The strongest lambs were £110.00-£119.00 with the next step down £95.00 plus. Medium keepers were £85-90.00 with only the very small and long keep less than £70.00.
